# VOCAL COMMUNICATION

Steps on how to teach your child to request (mand):

#### **PREPARE**

Place several items (toys/activities/snacks) that you know your child likes aside.



#### **TIPS**

Use items that are motivating and the labels of which are either in/close to what is already in your child's vocal repertoire.



## **TEACH**

Hold one of the items. If/when your child points to it, look at them expectantly & prompt the vocal response.



### **REWARD**

When the child requests/says a vocal approximation, provide the item IMMEDIATELY and lots of vocal praise!



### **REMINDERS:**

- Continue to shape the correct vocal approximations.
- An example of a prompt could be you saying the initial sound of the item and pointing to your mouth.

# VOCAL COMMUNICATION

Steps on how to teach your child to label (tact):

### **PREPARE**

Ensure the environment is full of stimulating objects/pictures/activities. An enriched environment is key.



#### **TIPS**

Always label activities, people, toys, objects, colours, numbers, pictures, animals etc. in your child's environment.




#### **TEACH**

Point to a picture of an apple on the wall and look expectantly at your child. Prompt them to say, "apple."



### **REWARD**

When your child says "apple" or an approximation, IMMEDIATELY provide praise/hugs/tickles/stickers etc. Ensure to use labeled praise, ex "Great saying apple"



### **REMINDERS:**

- Continue to shape the correct vocal approximations.
- An example of a prompt could be you saying the initial sound of the item and pointing to your mouth.

# VOCAL COMMUNICATION

Steps on how to teach your child to answer questions/fill in the blanks (intraverbals)

#### **PREPARE**

Set up a game where you can incorporate fill in the blanks statements.



#### **TIPS**

Try use a game that your child enjoys, for instance, if they like racing, practice "ready, set, \_\_\_\_" with them.



## **TEACH**

Whilst playing with your child, get two cars and say, "ready, set, \_\_\_." Hold your child's hand so s/he doesn't move the car & prompt them to say, "Go!"



### **REWARD**

When your child says "go" or an approximation, IMMEDIATELY provide praise and play the game with them.



### **REMINDERS:**

 Repetition and reward are crucial with each of these skills!
